Do you read newspaper comic strips? Magazine cartoons?

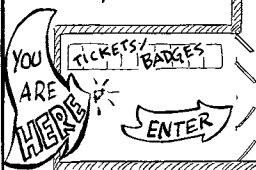
Do you read cartoons or strips on the Internet?

First, check the convention hall map to get your bearings. The convention program you get when you enter should contain just such a map. (This one is just an example.)



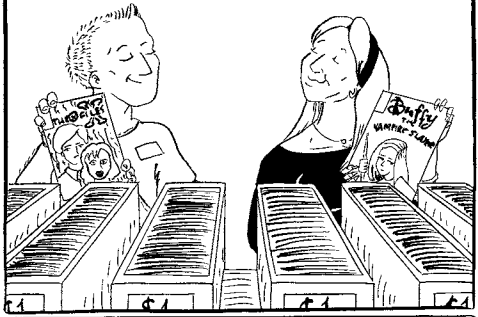

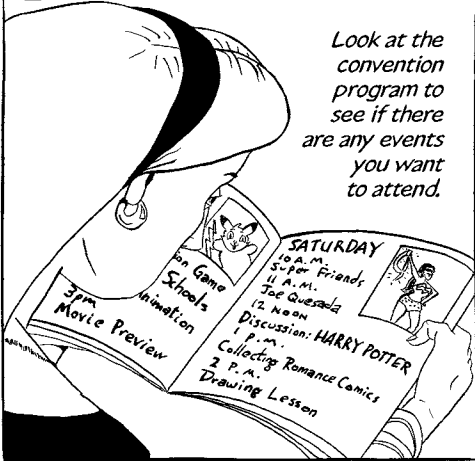
Two can play the childhood nostalgia game...

Look at the convention program to see if there are any events you want to attend.



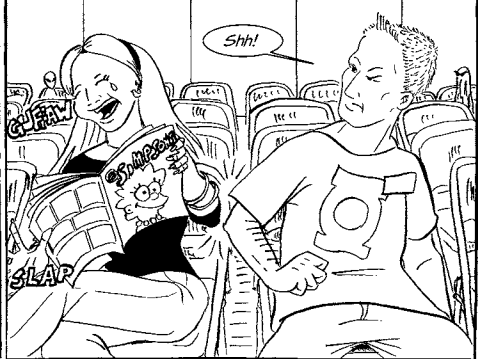
There's no need to be bored during events that interest him more than they do you...

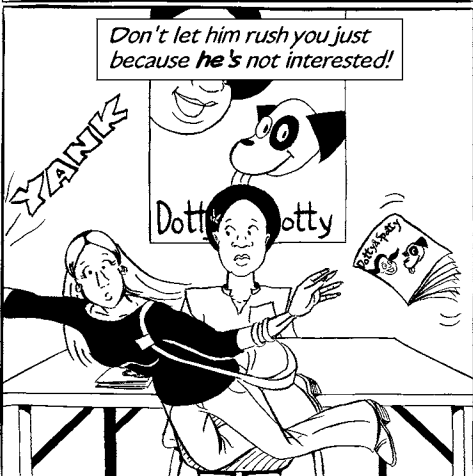
